Statement of Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

Macular Degeneration New Zealand has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

All amounts are recorded exclusive of GST, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Macular Degeneration New Zealand is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions. Macular Degeneration New Zealand is a registered charity CC42203.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 365 days or less.

Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation

Depreciation has been calculated on a diminishing value basis over the estimated useful life of the assets.

Debtors

Debtors have been recorded at their net realisable value

Revenue Recognition

Income is recognised when invoiced or receipted, except when income is received in advance. Income in advance is stated as a current liability when the funds hane not yet been expended, according to the authorised purpose, and the funds would be required to be repaid to the funder.

Note 8: Events After the Balance Date:

As mentioned in last year's Note 8 the impact of Covid has been significant on MDNZ's ability to deliver seminars throughout New Zealand. We have attempted to undertake as many as possible, however 41 seminars were planned with only 29 of these being delivered. It also impacted the number that we could arrange as community organistions were working on a watch and see principle, which prevented us from achieving our budget of 50. Our 0800 line was busy, however people are often encouraged to call us through our seminars. Also we took the opportunity to redirect our educator resource, instead she (along with other staff) undertook phone calls to people we communicate with to check on them during the lockdowns. This was very appreciated by everyone. We completed three newsletters, reduced by one from the budget, this was undertaken to lessen the possible risk from a reduction in funding caused by the impact of Covid. Resources continued to be delivered around the country to support the medical profession and our new website was launched, designed and created during lockdown.

Note 9: Ability to Continue Operating

The nature of the organisation is such that it is reliant on the continued support of its partners and funding bodies. The nature of the organisation also allows either cancellation or a reduction in delivering some services without incurring relative expenditure should funding slow down or cease. The management is confident of receiving ongoing support and accordingly has adopted the going concern assumption in the preparation of these financial statements.
